

Notes by the Way Lent 2023

We used to have a fridge magnet. It had a picture, which I don't remember and words on it which read:

'If they don't have chocolate in heaven, I'm not going.'

This fridge magnet was given to me by a friend who knew that I love chocolate. I have to confess I am more or less addicted to it.I tried to give it up once but I really missed it. The smooth taste of the creamy chocolate is delightful, whilst the sugar content gives one an energy boost and the confection as a whole can improve mood.

Remembering this 'chocolate occasion', I was reminded that Lent is a time when many people, for religious and other reasons decide to give something up....... Some use it as a prompt to lose weight or give up smoking. Others see it as a chance to reduce their consumption of a luxury in order to save money. There is nothing wrong, it seems to me, in attempting a more healthy lifestyle nor in improving your financial position by giving up on unnecessary, if delightful, pleasures, especially in these troublesome economic times. We should, though, not trivialise the very serious intent of Lent. Firstly, adopting the practice of giving something up, chocolate or otherwise, reminds us that the heart of the Good News is the message that Jesus gave up his own life for the sake of the world. This fundamental act of self denial puts our limited and often half-hearted attempts into a stunning perspective. The season of Lent is a preparation for the revisiting of the story of that suffering which Jesus endured on the cross and which led on to the victory of Easter.

Secondly, it's a time when we also have an opportunity to give up things that prevent us from giving ourselves 100% to the task of following the Way of Christ and living out the Good News of God's love for all people. As we meditate on the cost to that love of our salvation we will want to sideline anything that detracts from focussing on that love. Lent is the start of our personal journey towards Holy Week, the cross and Easter and a time for wondering at and worshipping the God who in Jesus pours himself out for lost humanity in an act of amazing love!

Refugees March 2023

West End Refugee Service

WERS has said that they have temporarily suspended their weekly drop ins and any new support casework "to allow our team at WERS to upskill further and undergo essential training to deliver the very best service to our clients." They hope to fully reopen in the Spring.

Meanwhile they are continuing to support those who receive the hardship fund and those involved in the buddying scheme. The Skillsmatch volunteering, gardening & other activities are also continuing.

"PLEASE HELP

Following on from our session and conversations with asylum seekers at one of the temporary acommodation sites in Newcastle, we would like to ask you to help us by providing some essentials for the people in need.

... We kindly ask for all items to be washed and in good condition prior to donating so that we can distribute them as soon as possible. Thank you!"

Justice and Peace Project

The latest update from J&PP says "462 clients have received support once or multiple times over the last three months. New clients continue to register with us from many places in the world, such as Iran, Afghanistan, El Salvador, Sudan, Syria and Eritrea. Many clients have been referred to us through other charities. Our support of all our clients is only possible because of your generosity, which we really appreciate."

In January they had 302 client visits; 50 of which were from people who have no government support. J&PP gave out vouchers to the value of £2030 and food bags to the value of £7134. Approximately 40 children were supported by the clothing store.

Comment

This week I went with several members of the Morpeth Justice and Peace group to listen to a talk in Newcastle given by an asylum seeker who has been waiting for 5 years for his claim to be settled. He had been trafficked and suffered the degradation of modern slavery. He is currently training to be a lawyer and is hoping to be granted asylum and to be in a position to support others in the same situation.

Our thoughts are obviously also focused on the appalling earthquake in Syria and Turkey and the thousands who have been killed and the many thousands who have been left traumatised and homeless.

I know things are difficult for many here at the present time and many don't have much to spare. Even if you are unable to make financial contributions, please remember refugees when you have items which you are discarding/replacing. Please also continue to pray for refugees and the people who work with them.
